## **Boston Tea Party-1773**

- "No Taxation without Representation"-Colonists felt this way because they were <u>used</u> to governing themselves (salutary neglect), and now the King wants to tax them without discussing it?
- (Tea Act of 1773)-Great Britain eliminated competition by only allowing <u>British East India Tea Company's</u> tea sold in the colonies (hurting colonial merchants)
- In response, <u>Samuel Adams</u> and the <u>Sons of Liberty</u> took several hundred chests of tea from the ships and dumped them into Boston Harbor (dressed as Indians)
- Great Britain punished Massachusetts for this (Intolerable Acts) by forcing the colonists to pay for the damages and closing the harbor



**Edenton Tea Party-1774** 

- More than 50 women, led by <u>Penelope Barker</u>, staged a <u>boycott</u> against British tea and clothing in Edenton, NC
- This was one of the earliest organized women's movements in history, in response to the Boston Tea Party
- The colonies praised the movement; Great Britain made fun of it
